- 1. Meeting called to order by Andreu Powell at 1 pm
- 2. Review and approval of May meeting minutes -- Motioned to approve minutes.
- 3. Hard copy of Worksite Wellness Resource Guide distributed. Additions: Jennifer Stein with First Coast Worksite Wellness Council gave a brief background/description of the guide, printed courtesy of the Worksite Wellness Subcommittee. She informed the group that the resources listed in the guide are specific to Nassau County, more copies can be printed if needed, and there will be updates to the online version as needed. Dr. Seidel invited interested members to join the Worksite Wellness Subcommittee.
- 4. Alexandra Davis with the American Cancer Society presented an overview of the ACS's programs and services, as well as Relay for Life Events coming up locally. She also emphasized that fundraising efforts stay local. (See power point for more information)

Highlights specific to Nassau:

- Hope Lodge- located on the Mayo Clinic campus, first in Jacksonville! Provides free transportation and lodging for cancer patients (and their families) who are receiving treatment within the service area.
- Road to Recovery run by volunteers and provides free rides to doctor appointments for cancer patients. Nassau is one of the counties with the highest number of volunteers for this program!
 - Additionally, other local cancer support services mentioned-- Virginia Caraway with the Barnabas Center informed the group of Jerry's Corner for Cancer Support (by appointment only). Lisa Rozier with Family Support Services mentioned Pinky promise, which serves the Westside of the county.
- New HPV Guidelines –including boys in vaccinations

- Every Kid Healthy Week at Yulee Elementary School-- after pledge cards for Screen-free
 week were collected, the children's suggestions for healthy activities were compiled into
 "Word Maps", visually representing common words and themes, such as "PLAY",
 "FRIENDS", "FUN", etc. This feedback gives guidance for future efforts to promote
 healthy physical activities that kids will enjoy doing, thus making them more effective.
- Healthiest Weight 16/17 Priorities for the upcoming year -- Emphasis on Health Equity through Healthy Places.
 - o Early Care and Education-best practices and HEPA
 - School Health and recognition through Healthier U.S. Schools Challenge: Smarter Lunchroom (HUSSC:SL),
 - o Worksite Wellness- CDC Scorecard
 - Healthcare Settings –chronic disease prevention (increase awareness of healthy blood pressure, heart disease and diabetes)
 - Community Champions –advancing health equity through Built Environment and Healthy Food Retail
