In addition to core public health services, we work on upstream factors that impact the achievement of optimal health for everyone who lives in or visits Nassau County.

2017—2018 Highlights

The Florida Department of Health Environmental Health Division in Nassau County (NCHD-EH) conducted a countywide environmental health assessment called PACE EH (Protocol for Assessing Community Excellence in Environmental Health) to improve health in the Evergreen community of Nassau County. PACE EH involves the community to evaluate local environmental health issues and set local priorities for action. The top three environmental health issues in Evergreen were identified as well as the PACE EH action plan implementation.

The Department of Health in Nassau County has been recognized by the National Association of County and City Health Officials (NACCHO) for a third consecutive time for its ability to plan for, respond to, and recover from public health emergencies. FDOH-Nassau in part of a cohort of more than 450 local Health Departments that have been distinguished for excellence in preparedness through Project Public Health Ready a unique partnership between NACCHO and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).

Emergency Preparedness

Trains staff to be prepared to work during times of disaster. Participate in County, State and National preparedness initiatives. Maintains partnerships for preparedness and response with key community entities, including public agencies, businesses, and community-based and faith-based organizations.

Provides birth and death certificate, a core public health function. Data collected from birth and deaths provides key health indicators regarding the health of our population.
